



2005 Cal Poly Baseball Season Outlook

Cal Poly, ranked as high as No. 31 in the national polls in 2004, broke the school record for wins in a season as a Division I member.

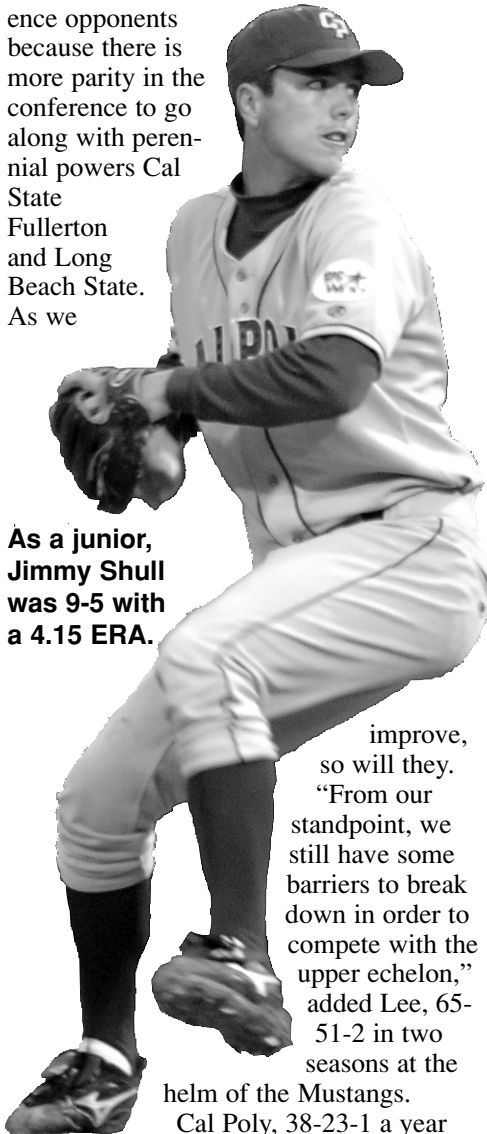
Now the Mustangs aim for an even loftier goal -- a berth in the NCAA Division I Tournament.

Ranked 38th in the 2005 preseason Baseball America poll, Cal Poly returns 19 lettermen, including three position starters and all three starting pitchers off a team that won 38 games and finished one victory shy of a third-place finish in the venerable Big West Conference, which produced the 2004 College World Series champion.

"The Big West is always one of the premier college baseball conferences in the country and continues to get stronger on a yearly basis," said third-year Cal Poly head coach Larry Lee. "It's difficult to determine where you might stand in relation to other conference opponents

because there is more parity in the conference to go along with perennial powers Cal State Fullerton and Long Beach State. As we

improve, so will they. "From our standpoint, we still have some barriers to break down in order to compete with the upper echelon," added Lee, 65-51-2 in two seasons at the helm of the Mustangs. Cal Poly, 38-23-1 a year

ago and at one time 20 games over the .500 mark for the first time since moving to Division I prior to the 1995 season, lost such standouts as relief pitcher Nolan Moser (the career saves leader with 12) and outfielders Sam Herbert (.383) and Chalon Tietje (.369). The Mustangs hit .313 as a team in 2004, second-best in the Big West, and seven Mustangs hit over the .300 mark, including shortstop Josh Mayo (.335) and catcher Cory Taillon (.317), both of whom were seniors as well.

But virtually the entire pitching staff returns, including starters Garrett Olson, Jimmy Shull and Jonathan Fleming and relievers Tony Saipe and Dennis LeDuc, and there are numerous veterans and newcomers ready to fill the void at the plate and on the field.

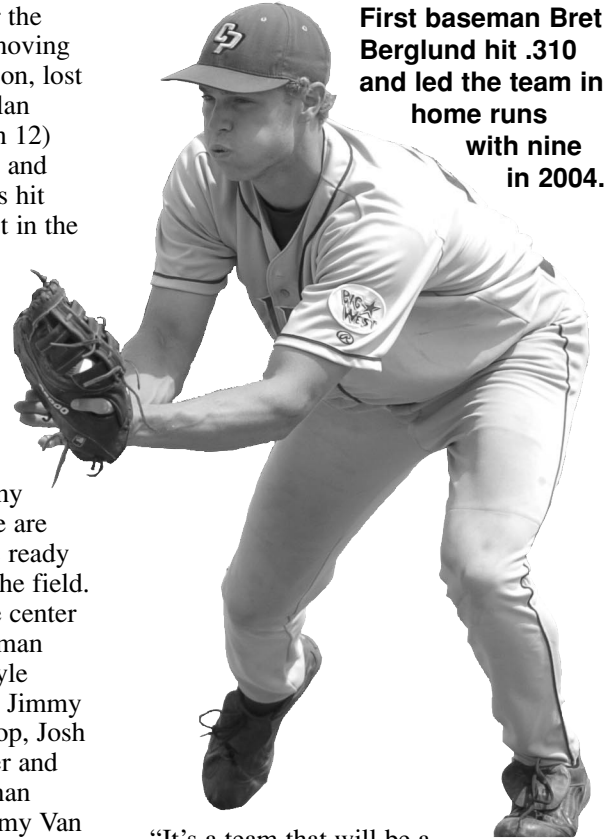
Leading the way with the bat are center fielder Brandon Roberts, first baseman Bret Berglund and utility player Kyle Blumenthal along with newcomers Jimmy Gardiner and Gilbert Gil at shortstop, Josh Lansford at third base, Matt Cooper and Sean Alexander in left field, Jonathan Woodcox behind the plate and Jimmy Van Ostrand in right field.

"We have a chance to be a solid offensive ballclub with some speed intermixed throughout the lineup," said Lee. "We won't be a power-hitting team, but will have some guys in the middle of our lineup who can bang it.

"We will use a combination of everything," Lee added. "Depending on what lineup we put out there, we might manufacture some runs, but we will take our swings as well. We have a chance to have four or five players in the starting lineup that can run. We're not necessarily a base-stealing team, but we will be a team that can put pressure on defenses."

Also throw into the mix redshirts Brent Walker at second base, Chad Pruett in center field and Kyle Carson and Chris Golik in right field, plus first baseman/designated hitter Steve Pettit, who sat out much of the 2004 season with an injury shortly after a brilliant game against Westmont in which he had four hits, including two triples and a home run, and drove in eight runs. Don't forget several of last year's reserves, such as catcher/designated hitter JJ Owen and infielder Drew Gillmore.

The Mustangs produced a .966 fielding percentage in 2004, not far off the school record of .972 established by the 2001 squad.

"It's a team that will be a work in progress," said Lee. "We have a number of converted players who will get better as the season goes along. We hope to learn from our early-season mistakes and put a starting eight out there that will take care of the ball."

All told, Cal Poly appears poised to make a run at a playoff berth and perhaps challenge the likes of Long Beach State and defending national champion Cal State Fullerton for the Big West title.

Pitching

Junior southpaw Garrett Olson (7-5, 5.57 ERA in 2004) had a superlative summer with the Anchorage Bucs, going 9-0 with a 0.67 ERA en route to a spot on the All-Alaska Baseball League Team. Right-hander Jimmy Shull (9-5, 4.15 ERA in 2004) was drafted in the eighth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks last June, but elected to return to Cal Poly for his senior season. Senior right-hander Jonathan Fleming (4-1, 3.48 ERA in 2004), Cal Poly's Saturday starter a year ago, missed most of the second half of the season due to injury and likely will come out of the bullpen as a long reliever this spring.

The third starter could be right-handed sophomore sophomore Gary Daley (3-1,

5.62 ERA in 2004) or junior left-hander Frank McLaughlin (2-1, 3.32 ERA in 2004).

Senior right-hander Tony Saipe (3-2, 3.67 ERA, 3 saves in 2004) heads a potentially deep Mustang bullpen which also includes senior right-hander Dennis LeDuc (4-4, 4.85 ERA, 2 saves in 2004), senior right-hander Mike Bille (who missed most of the 2004 season due to injury), sophomore right-hander Kevin Waldron (1-0, 4.74 ERA in 2004) and newcomer Rocky Roquet, who was 5-2 with a 6.18 ERA at Northeast Texas Community College a year ago and also pitched well for the San Luis Obispo Blues last summer (6-3, 2.70 ERA).

"Our pitching staff is much improved over last spring," said Lee. "Our key components are back with another year of experience under their belts. We will miss Moser, but overall the experience and development are better. We're losing only one pitcher, but it's a tough loss and someone hard to replace."

Catching

Senior Kyle Blumenthal started 15 games at first base a year ago, 14 at third, three at shortstop, 21 in left field, one in right and one as designated hitter. This year, the utility player extraordinaire will get a chance to fill the void left by Cory Taillon behind the plate. Blumenthal hit .303 with nine doubles, five home runs and 42 RBIs in 2004.

Blumenthal is being challenged by newcomer Jonathan Woodcox, a transfer from Chipola (Fla.) College, along with returnees Jon Marshall (.212) and JJ Owen (.194).

Infield

Returning first baseman Bret Berglund (.310 in 2004) likely will find himself with three newcomers at the other three infield positions on opening day. Berglund was Cal Poly's home run leader last spring with nine and had a midseason nine-game stretch in which he hit .517. He will be backed up by Steve Pettit and Jimmy Van Ostrand.

Brent Walker, who spent his freshman season at USC and then transferred to Cal Poly and redshirted last year, is the top candidate at second base. He was an all-county and all-league performer in both baseball and basketball at nearby Mission Prep.

Jimmy Gardiner, who hit .313 with 26 RBIs last season at Cuesta College, has the edge in a close battle at shortstop. Other contenders are returnee Drew Gillmore (.139 in 2004) and transfer Gilbert Gil, who is a nephew of Major League player Benji Gil and played at Saint Mary's last year.

Josh Lansford, another transfer, is the heir apparent at third base, backed up by Blumenthal and Gardiner. Lansford, son of former Major League standout Carney Lansford, hit .311 as a freshman at San Jose State last spring with 13 doubles, three home runs and 31 RBIs.

Outfield

Cal Poly will have a new outfielder from left to right this spring.

Junior Brandon Roberts, who hit .379 a year ago, stole 30 bases and produced a school-record 25-game hitting streak, will move from designated hitter to center field this spring. He was the Alaska Baseball League's batting champion with a .363 average for the Anchorage Bucs.

The job in right field figures to go to Jimmy Van Ostrand, who hit .321 as a sophomore and .378 as a freshman at Hancock College and in two seasons drove in 62 runs and stole 15 of 18 bases.

Left field appears to be a battle between Matt Cooper, Sean Alexander and Pat Pezet. Cooper hit .441 as a sophomore at Golden West College with 30 RBIs and eight stolen bases. Alexander is a transfer from Texas Tech, where he hit .337 in 2003 and also compiled a .366 average in two seasons at Bakersfield College.

Pezet is a true freshman from Casa

Grande High School in Petaluma and has impressed the coaching staff in pre-season workouts.

Other candidates in the outfield, all redshirt freshmen, are Chad Pruett, Kyle Carson, Chris Golik and Greg Swertfager.

Schedule

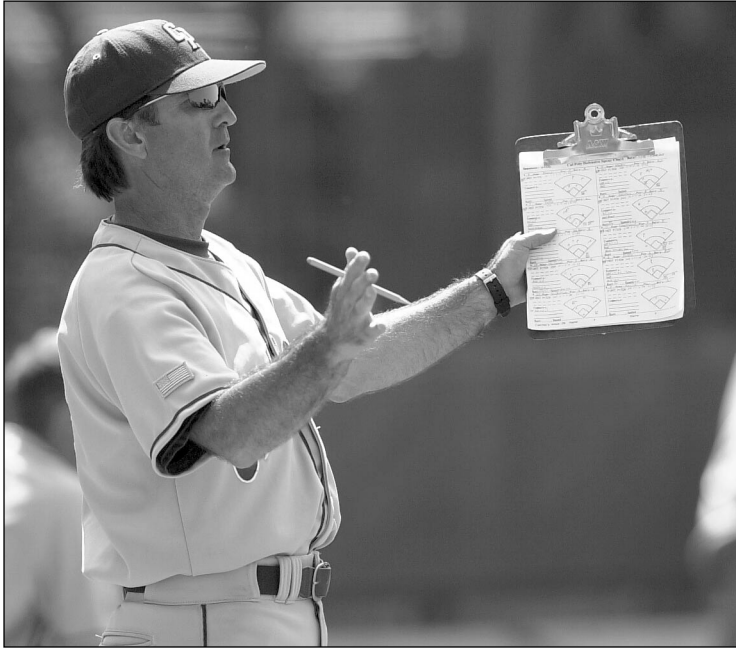
Cal Poly will play 15 games against teams which qualified for the 2004 NCAA Division I playoffs -- three games each with UCLA, Washington, Pepperdine, Long Beach State and Cal State Fullerton. The University of San Diego qualified for the 2003 playoffs.

The 2005 Mustang schedule will include 27 home dates, but Cal Poly opens its slate with six games on the road -- three each at San Diego and UCLA. The home schedule includes three-game series with San Jose State, San Francisco, Washington, Cal State Northridge, UC Davis, Sacramento State, UC Riverside and defending national champion Cal State Fullerton.

"We are trying to continue upgrading the caliber of competition with six games against the Pac-10 and six from the Western Athletic Conference," said Lee, whose team had the 36th strongest schedule among the 286 Division I schools in 2004, according to Boyd's World.

including a state-leading 44 wins in 1997. His teams qualified for the regionals 11 times in the last 13 years and Lee is No. 15 on the state's community college baseball coaches' list for career wins.

Under Lee's leadership, Cuesta claimed nine Western State Conference titles, including six in a row (1997-2002), and averaged 38 wins during that six-year stretch. His teams produced a 267-119 record in conference games.

During Lee's tenure at Cuesta from 1987-2002, he produced 26 all-state players, three Southern California Players of the Year and numerous professionals. Thirteen of his 16 teams finished above the .500 mark for the season, including the last seven.

Lee, who led his 2002 team to a school-record 24 consecutive wins en route to a 43-9 mark and a third-place state finish, was named conference coach of the year eight times.

In 11 postseason appearances, Lee's teams compiled a 34-28 win-loss record.

Lee, a 1979 San Luis Obispo High School graduate, was a standout baseball and football player for the Tigers before going on to play baseball at Santa Barbara City College (1980), Orange Coast College (1981) and Pepperdine University (1982-83).

Lee was a first-team All-South Coast Conference selection at Orange Coast as well as a second-team All-Southern California pick.

At Pepperdine, Lee was a career .304 hitter and, as a junior, earned first-team All-Southern California Baseball Association and second-team All-District 8 honors as the Waves posted a 46-21-1 record and earned a berth in the NCAA West Regional at Fresno State.

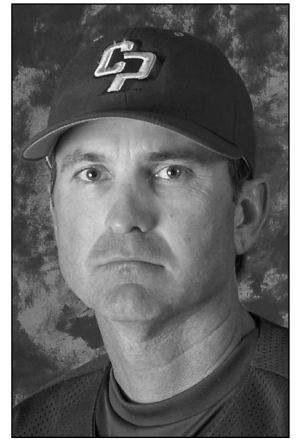
Lee hit 13 sacrifice flies for Pepperdine in 1982, which is tied for No. 2 in the NCAA record book for sacrifice flies in a season.

He enjoyed a brief professional baseball career, playing one year for the Utica Bluesox (1983) and ending his career with the Seattle Mariners' Single-A team in 1984.

Before becoming head coach at Cuesta College in 1987, Lee served as an assistant coach for the Cougars for two seasons (1984-85) and at Cal Poly for one year (1986) under Steve McFarland.

Lee earned his bachelor's degree in physical education/kinesiology from Pepperdine in 1983 and a master's degree in physical education from Cal Poly in 1985 as well as an adaptive physical education credential from Cal Poly in 1988.

Lee and his wife, Liz, reside in San Luis Obispo with two children, Jenna and Brooks.



The success Larry Lee enjoyed in 16 seasons as head baseball coach at Cuesta College has carried over to Cal Poly as the Mustangs posted a 38-23-1 record in 2004, breaking the school record for wins in a season as a member of Division I.

Lee begins his third season at Cal Poly with aspirations of a loftier finish in the Big West Conference and an appearance in the NCAA playoffs.

After serving as head baseball coach at Cuesta College for 16 seasons, Lee was hired on July 22, 2002 to guide the Mustang program.

Lee's first season finished a notch below the .500 mark at 27-28-1, but last year's squad jumped to a 28-12-1 start and finished 15 games

above the .500 level, posting its second straight fourth-place finish in the very competitive Big West Conference.

With an infusion of over 20 newcomers and the return of 22 letter winners, including 15 pitchers, hopes are high for greater success in 2005.

Lee led Cuesta to the California Community College State Final Four on four occasions, all in the last 11 years of his 16-year tenure. The Cougars reached the state's Final Four in 1992, 1997, 2001 and 2002 and qualified for the Southern California Regionals each of the last six years, including a No. 1 seed in 1999 and No. 2 in 2002.

Lee's overall record at Cuesta was 460-241-3,

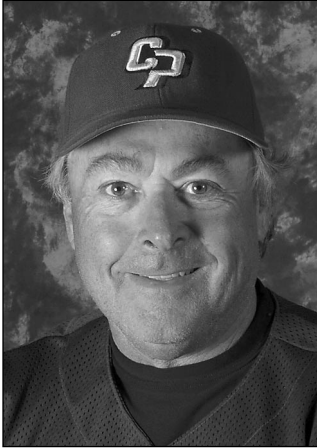

Cal Poly Assistant Baseball Coaches

JERRY WEINSTEIN Fourth Year



A very successful coach in the community college ranks, Jerry Weinstein is in his third collegiate coaching stint, serving his fourth year as an assistant coach at Cal Poly in charge of pitchers and catchers.

Weinstein compiled an 831-208-12 record in 23 seasons as head coach at Sacramento City College, guiding the Panthers to 16 conference championships, two co-conference titles, a state title in 1988 and a national crown in 1998. His 831 career wins is No. 1 among all California community college baseball coaches.

His previous college coaching stints were one season (1984) as assistant coach at Miami (Fla.) and two seasons (1966, 1968) as freshman baseball coach at UCLA.

Weinstein also has served as assistant coach for two United States Olympic teams (1992, 1996) and one U.S. Pan American Games team (1987).

Weinstein also has coached at Los Angeles Valley College (1972-74), Santa Monica High School (1969-71) and Pioneer High School in Whittier (1967).

Weinstein served as catching coordinator for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1999 and was Director of Player Development for the Dodgers in 2000 and 2001. He also has managed several minor league teams for the Milwaukee Brewers, Montreal Expos and Chicago Cubs.

Weinstein is a member of the California Community College Baseball Hall of Fame and Sacramento City College Sports Hall of Fame. He was named National Community College Baseball Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1998 and developed 27 players at Sacramento City College who went on to play in the Major Leagues.

Weinstein earned his bachelor's degree in history at UCLA in 1965 and earned a master's degree in physical education at UCLA in 1969. He has written numerous magazine articles and manuals and has produced five baseball instructional videos.

JESSE ZEPEDA Second Year



Jesse Zepeda, who played baseball under Larry Lee at Cuesta College, joined the Cal Poly coaching staff in September 2003 as a fulltime assistant coach and is primarily responsible for the infielders and hitting.

A 1992 Righetti High School graduate, Zepeda went on to play baseball at Fresno State (1993), Cuesta College (1994) and the University of Oklahoma (1995-96) as a shortstop. Zepeda, a sociology major at Oklahoma, was a second-team preseason All-American in 1995 and played for Oklahoma in the 1995 College World Series.

Zepeda was drafted in the 23rd round and signed with the Detroit Tigers in 1996. He played four seasons (1996-

99) in the minor leagues -- one with the Tigers' organization and three more with the Toronto Blue Jays' organization -- and was called up by the Blue Jays to play in the Hall of Fame game, an exhibition contest, in Cooperstown, N.Y., in 1998.

In 2000 Zepeda played in the Western Independent League for the Solano Steelheads. He was named MVP of the National Baseball Congress World Series in 1994.

For nearly three years, Zepeda worked for the Santa Barbara County Probation Department as a juvenile institutions officer. He married Brianna three years ago and has one son, Elisha Zepeda, 8.

In 2003 Zepeda was an assistant coach at Hancock College and was an assistant with the semi-pro Santa Maria Indians that summer.

CASEY HAHN First Year



Casey Hahn was appointed to the position of volunteer assistant coach at Cal Poly last August.

Hahn was an assistant coach for the Waterloo Bucks in the Northwoods League the last two summers and served as the pitching coach at Cuesta College for the 2004 season. The Cougars won the Western State Conference championship in 2004.

Originally from Morrison, Illinois, Hahn played collegiate baseball for the University of Illinois Fighting Illini

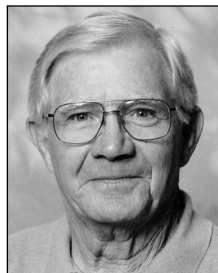
under head coach Richard "Itch" Jones. The right-handed relief pitcher played summer baseball with the Twin City Stars of the Central Illinois Collegiate League in 1999, 2000 and 2001 and was a member of the San Luis Obispo Blues team in 2002 which placed third in the National Baseball Congress World Series.

Hahn was an assistant coach for Waterloo under field manager Andy Haines in 2003.

Born Dec. 18, 1979, Hahn graduated from Illinois in 2003 with a degree in speech communications.

Hahn's primary coaching responsibility at Cal Poly is the outfielders.

DICK MORROW Administrative Assistant



Dick Morrow, a 1955 Cal Poly graduate and a former Mustang third baseman in the early 1950s, returns for his seventh season assisting the Cal Poly baseball coaching staff.

Morrow was head baseball and basketball coach at San Luis Obispo High School from 1961-65 and was a counselor at the school for 25 years, retiring in 1987.

He was a Pismo Beach city councilman from 1986-94 and served as mayor four years. He was an assistant baseball coach at Cal Poly under Howie O'Daniels in 1956.

Morrow earned his bachelor's degree at Cal Poly in 1955 and a master's degree in 1960. He earned an education specialist certificate from Michigan State in 1972.

Morrow served for the U.S. Army in the Korean War in 1953 and 1954.
